Fees, Charges and Refunds





INDICATIVE FEES

The student tuition fees are indicative only and subject to change given individual circumstances at enrolment. Additional fees may apply such as student services and amenity fees'.

Explanation of Fees and Charges

Concession Fee

This category is applicable to students who are upskilling and eligible for a concession. Concessions will be granted upon presentation of a valid Centrelink issued health/pensioner/veteran gold card. This should be presented at the time of enrolment. If this is not possible, you will be charged Full Fees, until such time as evidence of concession entitlement is provided. If you can provide evidence that states that you were eligible at the time of enrolment you may apply for a refund.

Non Concession

This category is applicable to those students who are not eligible for a concession.

Fee for Service Programs

As per course fee advice. Concessions are not available on Fee For Service programs

Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF)

The SSAF is a compulsory fee charged by GEST to support a range of student services.

Materials Charges

In some courses, materials charges may apply to cover items such as first aid training, equipment and learner guides.

Job Seekers

If you are a registered job seeker, we suggest you contact your job services provider to explore whether any fee assistance is available.

Withdrawals and Refunds

Students can withdraw from a program at any stage. For students wishing to withdraw and apply for a refund of fees, they are required to withdraw no longer than 4 weeks from the commencement date of the course.

Withdrawals lodged on a GEST Application Withdrawal Form within this period will result in a refund of the tuition fees paid, less the minimum charge. Withdrawals after a 4 week period will not be considered for a refund of fees.
